#### TUESDAY, 20TH OCTOBER, 1931.

- 1. The House met, at three o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Deputy-Speaker (Mr. D. C. McGrath) took the Chair, and offered Prayers.
- 2. Wimmera Electoral Division—Issue of Writ.—Mr. Deputy-Speaker announced to the House that it was the intention of Mr. Speaker to issue a Writ, on Thursday, the 29th instant, for the Election of a Member to serve for the Electoral Division of Wimmera, in the State of Victoria, in the place of the Honorable Percy Gerald Stewart, deceased. The dates in connexion with the Election would be fixed as follows:—

Thursday, 29th October, 1931. Date of Nomination Monday, 9th November, 1931. • • . . . . Saturday, 28th November, 1931. Date of Polling Date of Return of Writ . . On or before Tuesday, 15th December, 1931.

4. CUSTOMS BILL (1931).—Mr. Forde (Minister for Trade and Customs) moved, pursuant to notice, That he have leave to bring in a Bill for an Act to amend the Customs Act 1901-1930. Question—put and passed.

Mr. Forde moved, pursuant to contingent notice, That the Standing Orders be suspended, to enable the remaining stages to be passed without delay.

Question—put and passed.

The Resolution reported from the Committee was read, and, on the motion of Mr. Forde, was adopted by the House.

Ordered—That Mr. Forde and Mr. McNeill do prepare and bring in a Bill to carry out the foregoing

Mr. Forde then brought up a Bill intituled "A Bill for an Act relating to Duties of Excise," and moved, That it be now read a first time.

Question—put and passed.—Bill read a first time.

Mr. Forde moved, That the Bill be now read a second time.

Debate ensued.

Question—put and passed.—Bill read a second time.

Mr. Deputy-Speaker left the Chair, and the House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole.

(In the Committee.)

Bill, by leave, taken as a whole, and agreed to.

Bill to be reported without amendment.

The House resumed; Mr. Keane reported accordingly.

On the motion of Mr. Forde, the House adopted the Report, and the Bill was read a third time.

6. Message from the Senate.—Flax and Linseed Bounties Bill (1931).—Mr. Deputy-Speaker announced the receipt of the following Message from the Senate:-
