- 1. The House met, at three o'clock p.m., according to the terms of the Resolution of the 17th March last.—Mr. Speaker (the Honorable G. H. Mackay) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2. Suspension of Standing Orders.—Mr. Lyons (Prime Minister) moved, That the Standing Orders be suspended so as to enable a Bill for an Act to amend the Financial Agreements Enforcement Act 1932 to be introduced and passed through all its stages without delay.

- 7. MINISTERIAL STATEMENT-IMPERIAL ECONOMIC CONFERENCE AT OTTAWA.-Mr. Lyons (Prime Minister), by leave, made a Ministerial Statement announcing that the Australian Delegation to the forthcoming Imperial Economic Conference at Ottawa would consist of the Right Honorable S. M. Bruce, C.H., P.C., M.C., Assistant Treasurer, and the Honorable H. S. Gullett, Minister for Trade and Customs. Mr. Lyons also informed the House of the names of the officers, representatives of industry and commerce, and others accompanying the Delegation.
- 8. ADJOURNMENT.—Mr. Lyons (Prime Minister) moved, That the House do now adjourn. Debate ensued. Question—put and passed.
