## THURSDAY, 28TH APRIL, 1932.

- 1. The House met, at half-past two o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker (the Honorable G. H. Mackay) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2. LEAVE OF ABSENCE TO MEMBER (Mr. HUNTER).—Mr. Earle Page moved, by leave, That leave of absence for one month be given to the honorable Member for Maranoa (Mr. Hunter), on the ground of ill-health.

Question -- put and passed.

3. Leave of Absence to Member (Mr. Latham).—Mr. Lyons (Prime Minister) moved, by leave, That leave of absence for two months be given to the Attorney-General (Mr. Latham), on the ground of urgent public business.

Question-put and passed.

- 4. Papers.—The following Papers were presented, pursuant to Statute—
  Export Guarantee Act—Return showing assistance granted to 31st March, 1932.

  Taxation—Fourteenth Report of the Commissioner, years 1927-28, 1928-29, 1929-30 and
- 5. Australian Broadcasting Commission Bill.—The Order of the Day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question, That the Bill be now read a second time—Debate resumed.

Question—put and passed.—Bill read a second time.

Mr. Speaker left the Chair, and the House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole.

(In the Committee.)

Clauses 1 to 4 agreed to.

Clause 5-

On the motion of Mr. Fenton (Postmaster-General), the following amendment was made:—
Page 2, lines 5-6, omit ", subject to such directions (if any) as are from time to time given by the
Minister".

Clause, as amended, agreed to.

Clauses 6 and 7 agreed to.

Clause 8 debated-

Mr. Thompson moved, as an amendment, That the words "Five hundred" be omitted with a view to the insertion of the words "Four hundred and ninety-nine" in place thereof.

Debate continued.

Question—That the words proposed to be omitted stand part of the clause—put. The Committee divided (The Chairman, Mr. Bell, in the Chair)—

The House resumed; Mr. Bell reported accordingly.

Resolved—That the House will, at the next sitting, again resolve itself into the said Committee.

6. Message from the Senate.—Financial Agreements Enforcement Bill (No. 2) (1932).—Mr. Speaker announced the receipt of the following Message from the Senate:—

Clause agreed to.

The Senate returns to the House of Representatives the Bill for "An Act to amend the Financial Agreements Enforcement Act 1932'," and acquaints the House that the Senate has agreed to the Bill without amendment.
