- 3. DAYS OF BUSINESS —ALTERATION.—Mr. Lyons (Prime Minister) moved, by leave, That, unless otherwise ordered, the House shall meet on each Tuesday at three o'clock p.m.; on each Wednesday and Thursday at half-past two o'clock p.m.; and on each Friday at half-past ten o'clock a.m. Question—put and passed.
- 4. MESSAGE FROM THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL.—AUSTRALIAN BROADCASTING COMMISSION BILL.—The following Message from His Excellency the Governor-General was presented, and the same was read by Mr. Speaker :—

ISAAC A. ISAACS, Governor-General.

Message No. 6.

In accordance with the requirements of section 56 of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Australia, the Governor-General recommends to the House of Representatives that an appropriation of revenue be made for the purposes of a Bill for an Act relating to Broadcasting. 15th March, 1932.

Ordered-That the foregoing Message be taken into consideration, in Committee of the whole House, forthwith.

Mr. Speaker left the Chair, and the House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole.

Mr. Fenton (Postmaster-General) moved, That it is expedient that an appropriation of revenue be made for the purposes of a Bill for an Act relating to Broadcasting.

5. AUSTRALIAN BROADCASTING COMMISSION BILL.-The Order of the Day having been read for the further consideration of this Bill in Committee of the whole House-Mr. Speaker left the Chair, and the House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole.

Clause 15-

Mr. Earle Page moved, as an amendment, That sub-clause (1.) be omitted with a view to the insertion of the following sub-clause :-

"(1.) A general manager shall be appointed by the Governor-General, shall hold office for a period not exceeding five years, and shall be eligible for re-appointment.".
