1. The House met, at half-past ten o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker (the Honorable G. H. Mackay) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
2. PAPER.—The following Paper was presented, pursuant to Statute—
Post and Telegraph Act—Regulations Amended—Statutory Rules 1932, No. 106.
3. MINISTERIAL STATEMENT—WAR PENSION APPEALS.—Mr. Marr (Minister for Repatriation), by leave, made a Ministerial Statement in regard to the disposal of cases in which Appeals to the War Pensions Entitlement Appeal Tribunal and Appeals to the War Pensions Assessment Appeal Tribunal have been lodged.
4. SUPPLY [BUDGET DEBATE].—The House, according to Order, resolved itself into the Committee of Supply.

(In the Committee.)

General debate resumed on the question (see page 279), That the first item in the Estimates under Division I.—The Parliament—namely—

The President £1,300

be agreed to, and on the Amendment moved thereto by Mr. Scullin, That the first item be reduced by £1.

Progress to be reported, and leave asked to sit again.

The House resumed; Mr. Bell reported accordingly.

Resolved—That the House will, at the next sitting, again resolve itself into the said Committee.

5. ADJOURNMENT.—Mr. Parkhill (Postmaster-General) moved, That the House do now adjourn.
Debate ensued.
Question—put and passed.

And then the House, at one minute to four o'clock p.m., adjourned until Tuesday next at three o'clock p.m.
