MINISTERIAL STATEMENT—OTTAWA TRADE AGREEMENT AND IMPORTATION OF BANANAS FROM FIJI.— Mr. Lyons (Prime Minister), by leave, made a Ministerial Statement with reference to the provision for importation of bananas from Fiji into Australia in the Trade Agreement signed at Ottawa between the Government of the United Kingdom and the Commonwealth Government.
- 3. Paper.—The following Paper was presented, pursuant to Statute—
 Australian Soldiers' Repatriation Act—War Pensions Entitlement Appeal Tribunal—Report for year 1931-32.
- 4. ADJOURNMENT-MOTION FOR PURPOSE OF DISCUSSION.-Mr. Beasley rose in his place, and said that he proposed to move the adjournment of the House for the purpose of discussing a definite matter of urgent public importance, namely, "The necessity for the Government to take immediate action to provide a substantial amount of money for the relief of the unemployed throughout the Commonwealth prior to Christmas ".
