### TUESDAY, 4TH APRIL, 1933.

- 1. The House met, at three o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker (the Honorable G. H. Mackay) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2. DISCHARGE OF ORDER OF THE DAY. The following Order of the Day, General Business

Western Australia Exclusive Power by State to enact Customs and Excise legislation—Resumption of debate upon the motion of Mr. Gregory, That, in the opinion of this House, it is desirable that legislation should be enacted to provide for the submission to the electors of a proposal to alter the Constitution with a view to enabling the Parliament to grant to the State of Western Australia the exclusive power of enacting laws relating to Customs and of Excise within that State for a period of 25 years from the date of granting such power; provided that any such laws of such State shall not impose any duties of Customs or of Excise on goods produced or manufactured in any other State of the Commonwealth—was discharged, on the motion, by leave, of Mr. Gregory.
