- 4. MINISTERIAL STATEMENT—ROYAL COMMISSION ON PETROL.—Mr. Latham (Attorney-General), by leave, made a Ministerial Statement announcing the personnel and the terms of reference of the Royal Commission about to be appointed to inquire into the question of Petroleum Oil.
- 5. Customs Tariff Proposals of the Government—Attitude of Country Party—Statement.—
 Mr. Thomas Paterson (Acting Leader of the Country Party), by leave, made a Statement with reference to the attitude of the Country Party to the Customs Tariff Proposals of the Government.
 Mr. Latham (Attorney-General) and Mr. Scullin (Leader of the Opposition), by leave, also made Statements with reference to the matter.

That the Schedule to the Excise Tariff 1921-1928 as proposed to be amended by Excise Tariff Proposals be further amended as hereunder set out, and that on and after the seventh day of April, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, reckoned according to standard time in the Territory for the Seat of Government, Duties of Excise be collected in pursuance of the Excise Tariff as so amended.

That in this Resolution "Excise Tariff Proposals" means the Excise Tariff Proposals introduced into the House of Representatives on the following dates, namely:—

25th February, 1932; 24th May, 1932; and 8th March, 1933.
