9. MESSAGE FROM THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL.-LOAN BILL (No. 2) (1934).-The following Message from His Excellency the Governor-General was presented, and the same was read by Mr. Speaker :---

ISAAC A. ISAACS,

Governor-General.

Message No. 2.

In accordance with the requirements of section 56 of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Australia, the Governor-General recommends to the House of Representatives that an appropriation of moneys be made for the purposes of a Bill for an Act to authorize the raising of a certain sum of money and for other purposes.

Canberra, 13th November, 1934.

Ordered-That the foregoing Message be taken into consideration, in Committee of the whole House, forthwith.
