### MONDAY, 8TH APRIL, 1935.

1. The House met, at eleven o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker (the Honorable G. J. Bell) took the Chair, and read Prayers.

2. Death of Member (The Honorable David Watkins).—Mr. Earle Page (Acting Prime Minister) having announced, with deep regret, the death on the provious day of the Honorable David Watkins, moved, by leave, That this House expresses its deep regret at the death of the Honorable David Watkins, Member for the Division of Newcastle in the House of Representatives, a Member of the first and each succeeding Parliament of the Commonwealth, and a former Member of the Parliament of New South Wales, places on record its appreciation of his meritorious public service, and tenders its profound sympathy to the members of his family in their bereavement.

And Mr. Scullin (Leader of the Opposition) having seconded the motion, and other honorable Members having addressed the House in support thereof, and all Members present having risen, in silence-

Question—passed.

Resolved.—That Mr. Speaker be requested to transmit to the relatives of the deceased Member the foregoing Resolution, together with a copy of the speeches delivered thereon.

- 3. Suspension of Sitting as Mark of Respect.—As a mark of respect to the memory of the late honorable Member, the sitting was thereupon suspended until fifteen minutes to two o'clock p.m.
- 4. RESUMPTION OF SITTING.—At fifteen minutes to two o'clock p.m., Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair,
- 5. ALTERATION OF DAY OF NEXT MEETING .- Mr. Earle Page (Acting Prime Minister) moved, That the House, at its rising, adjourn until to-morrow at eleven o'clock a.m. Question--put and passed.
- 6. Mineral Oils and Petrol and other Products of Mineral Oils -Reports (Majority and MINORITY) OF ROYAL COMMISSION-MOTION FOR PRINTING PAPER. -Mr. Earle Page (Acting Prime Minister) laid upon the Table, by command of His Excellency the Governor-General, the following Paper :

Mineral Oils and Petrol and other Products of Mineral Oils-Reports of Royal Commission-

(1) Majority Report—Hon. John Gunn and A. J. Hancock, Esq., F.I.C.A.;
(2) Minority Report—S. Ernest Lamb, Esq., K.C., Chairman, and moved, That the Paper be printed.

Mr. Beasley addressing the House and not having concluded his speech—the House ordered that the honorable Member have leave to continue his speech when the debate is resumed.

- 8. LEAGUE OF NATIONS FIFTEENTH ASSEMBLY-REPORT OF AUSTRALIAN DELEGATION-MOTION FOR PRINTING PAPER. -Mr. Hughes (Vice-President of the Executive Council) laid upon the Table, by command of His Excellency the Governor-General, the following Paper:

League of Nations--Fifteenth Assembly, September, 1934—Report of Australian Delegation,

and moved, That the Paper be printed.

Sir Littleton Groom moved, That the debate be now adjourned.

Question—That the debate be now adjourned—put and passed.

9. WHEAT GROWERS RELIEF BILL (1935).—The Order of the Day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question, That the Bill be now read a second time-

Debate resumed. Question—put and passed.—Bill read a second time.

Mr. Speaker left the Chair, and the House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole.

(In the Committee.)

Clause 1 agreed to. Clause 2 debated-

Mr. A. G. Cameron moved, as an amendment, That the following proviso be added to sub-section (1.) of proposed new section 6a:—": Provided that the sum paid to any applicant under this Act added to the sum paid under the Wheat Bounty Act 1934 shall not exceed an amount in excess of the average amount paid per acre in that State under the Wheat Bounty Act 1934.".

Debate continued.

Amendment withdrawn, by leave.

On the motion of Mr. Earle Page (Acting Prime Minister), the following amendments were made:—Page 2, line 4, after "State" insert "that they are in adverse financial circumstances and ". Page 2, line 6, omit "and hardship".

Page 2, at the end of the clause add the following sub-section:—

"(3.) Any amount applied under this section by a State in providing relief to a wheat grower, shall be paid directly to that wheat grower.".

Clause, as amended, agreed to.

New Clause-

On the motion of Mr. Earle Page, the following new clause was added to the Bill:-

3. Section seven of the Wheat Growers Relief Act (No. 2) 1934 is amended by

inserting at the end thereof the following proviso:—

"Provided that nothing in this section shall affect the right of a wheat grower to receive payment direct of any amount payable to him by way of relief under section six A of this Act.".

Preamble agreed to. Title agreed to.

Bill to be reported with amendments.

The House resumed; Mr. Prowse reported accordingly.
On the motion of Mr. Earle Page (the Standing Orders having previously been suspended, see page 140), the House adopted the Report, and the Bill was read a third time.

10. Message from the Governor-General.—Supply Bill (No. 1) 1935-36.—The following Message from His Excellency the Governor-General was presented, and was read by Mr. Speaker :-

Message No. 24.

In accordance with the requirements of section 56 of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Australia, the Governor-General recommends to the House of Representatives that an appropriation of revenue be made for the purposes of a Bill for an Act to grant and apply a sum out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund for the service of the year ending the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and thirty-six.
