- 1. The House met, at three o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment.--Mr. Speaker (the Honorable G. J. Bell) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2. MINISTERIAL STATEMENT-SIR CHARLES KINGSFORD SMITH.-Mr. Parkhill (Minister for Defence), by leave, made a Ministerial Statement informing the House of the steps taken in carrying out a search for Air-Commodore Sir Charles Kingsford Smith, missing on an aeroplane flight between England and Australia.

3. PAPERS.—The following Papers were presented, pursuant to Statute---

- Navigation Act—Regulations—Statutory Rules 1935, No. 100. Science and Industry Research Act—Ninth Annual Report of the Council for Scientific and Industrial Research, for year 1934-35.
- 4. SUPPLY-ESTIMATES, 1935-36.-The House, according to Order, resolved itself into the Committee of Supply.
