1. The House met, at half-past ten o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker (the Honorable G. J. Bell) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
2. SUPPLY ESTIMATES, 1936-37.—The House, according to Order, resolved itself into the Committee of Supply.

(*In the Committee.*)

Vote "The Department of Trade and Customs, £596,520"—debated and agreed to.

Vote "The Department of Health, £125,450"—debated—

*Limitation of Debate.*—At sixteen minutes to one o'clock p.m., the Chairman having called the attention of the Committee to the fact that the time allotted for the Vote had expired—

Question—That the Vote be agreed to—put and passed.

Vote "The Department of Commerce, £428,210"—debated.

Progress to be reported, and leave asked to sit again.

The House resumed; Mr. Prowse reported accordingly.

Resolved—That the House will, at the next sitting, again resolve itself into the said Committee.

3. DEATH OF MEMBER (SIR LITTLETON GROOM).—Mr. Earle Page (Minister for Commerce) announced, with deep regret, the death, a few minutes ago, of the honorable Member for Darling Downs (Sir Littleton Ernest Groom, K.C.M.G., K.C.).
4. ADJOURNMENT.—Mr. Earle Page (Minister for Commerce) thereupon moved, as a mark of respect to the memory of the late honorable gentleman, That the House do now adjourn.  
And all honorable Members having risen, in silence—  
Question—passed.

And then the House, at twenty-six minutes to three o'clock p.m., adjourned until Tuesday next at three o'clock p.m.
