- 3. WAR WITH GERMANY-MINISTERIAL STATEMENT.-Mr. McEwen (Minister for External Affairs), by leave, made a Ministerial Statement informing the House of the latest reports of the fighting in Belgium and Northern France.
- 4. Alteration of Hour of Next Meeting.—Mr. Cameron (Minister for Commerce) moved, That the House, at its rising, adjourn until eleven o'clock a.m. to-morrow. Question—put and passed.
