- 1. The House met, at half-past ten o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment .-- Mr. Speaker (the Honorable G. J. Bell) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2. ALTERATION OF DAY OF NEXT MEETING .-- Mr. Menzics (Prime Minister) moved, That the House, at its rising, adjourn until Wednesday next at three o'clock p.m. Question-put and passed.
- 3. WAR-TIME (COMPANY) TAX ASSESSMENT BILL 1940.—The Order of the Day having been read for the further consideration of this Bill in Committee of the whole House--

Mr. Speaker left the Chair, and the House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole.

(In the Committee.)

Clauses 1 and 2 agreed to. Clause 3-

On the motion of Mr. Spender (Treasurer), the following amendments were made :-

Page 2, line 7, alter " adopted " insert ", or deemed to have been adopted,". Page 2, line 29, after " receive " insert ", either directly or indirectly,".

- Mr. Spender moved, as a further amendment, That the definition of "taxable profit" (page 2, lines 42 45) be omitted and the following definition inserted in place thereof :--
 - ' taxable profit' means the amount remaining after deducting from the taxable income of the accounting period as assessed under the Income Tax Assessment Act-
 - (a) the income tax payable in respect of that taxable income;
 - (b) so much of any dividend received by a company in respect of its shareholdings in any other company as is included in the taxable income of that firstmentioned company of the accounting period ; and
 - (c) in the case of the first accounting period of a company formed after the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine, any tax payable under the law of any State on the income derived by that company during that accounting period;

Debate ensued.

Progress to be reported, and leave asked to sit again.

The House resumed ; Mr. Prowse reported accordingly. Resolved-That the House will, at the next sitting, again resolve itself into the said Committee.

4. GOLD MINING ENCOURAGEMENT BILL (No. 2) 1940 .- The Order of the Day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question, That the Bill be now read a second time-

Debate resumed.

Question-put and passed.-Bill read a second time.

Mr. Speaker left the Chair, and the House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole.

(In the Committee.)

Bill, by leave, taken as a whole, and agreed to. Bill to be reported without amendment.

The House resumed ; Mr. Prowse reported accordingly.

On the motion of Mr. Spender (Treasurer), the House adopted the Report, and, by leave, the Bill was read a third time.

- 6. PAPUA BILL 1940.—The Order of the Day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question, That the Bill be now read a second time— Debate resumed.

Question—put and passed.—Bill read a second time.

Mr. Speaker left the Chair, and the House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole.

(In the Committee.)

Bill, by leave, taken as a whole, and agreed to. Bill to be reported without amendment.

The House resumed; Mr. Prowse reported accordingly: On the motion of Mr. Nock (Minister in charge of External Territories), the House adopted the Report, and, by leave, the Bill was read a third time.

7. ADJOURNMENT.-Mr. Spender (Treasurer) moved, That the House do now adjourn.

Debate ensued. Question-put and passed.

And then the House, at twenty minutes to five o'clock p.m., adjourned until Wednesday next at three o'clock p.m.
