1. The House met, at half-past two o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker (the Honorable W. M. Nairn) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
2. ADVANCES ON WHEAT—MINISTERIAL STATEMENT.—Sir Earle Page (Minister for Commerce), by leave, made a Ministerial Statement informing the House that funds had been made available to the Australian Wheat Board for a final payment on wheat in No. 2 and No. 3 Pools and for a second advance on wheat in No. 4 Pool.
3. PAPER.—The following Paper was presented, pursuant to Statute—  
Lands Acquisition Act—Land acquired for Defence purposes—Lithgow, New South Wales.
4. COMMONWEALTH CONCILIATION AND ARBITRATION BILL 1941.—Mr. Hughes (Attorney-General) moved, pursuant to notice, That he have leave to bring in a Bill for an Act to amend the *Commonwealth Conciliation and Arbitration Act 1904-1934*.

5. PRIME MINISTER'S MISSION ABROAD AND WAR POSITION—MINISTERIAL STATEMENT—MOTION FOR PRINTING PAPER.—The Order of the Day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the following motion of Mr. Menzies (Prime Minister), That the Paper [*presented on the 28th May last*], viz. :—
