- 1. The House met, at half-past ten o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker (the Honorable J. S. Rosevear) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2. THIRD LIBERTY LOAN—MINISTERIAL STATEMENT.—Mr. Chifley (Treasurer), by leave, made a Ministerial Statement informing the House of the results of the Third Liberty Loan.
- 3. Map Showing Defence Plans—Statement by Member.—Mr. Fadden (Leader of the Opposition), by leave, made a Statement with reference to a map circulated by the honorable Member for Maranoa which purported to show areas proposed to be evacuated in the event of invasion.
- 4. ROYAL AUSTRALIAN AIR FORCE—ACTING AND SUBSTANTIVE RANKS—MINISTERIAL STATEMENT.—
 Mr. Drakeford (Minister for Air), by leave, made a Ministerial Statement informing the House of the principles underlying the grant and retention of acting rank and in relation to promotions generally in the Royal Australian Air Force.
- 5. STATEMENT BY MEMBER—LEAVE TO MAKE NOT GRANTED.—Mr. McEwen asked leave to make a Statement.
 - Objection being raised, leave not granted.
- 6. ALTERATION OF DAY OF NEXT MEETING.—Mr. Curtin (Prime Minister) moved, That the House, at its rising, adjourn until Wednesday next at three o'clock p.m. Question—put and passed.
- 7. Adjournment-Motion for Purpose of Discussion.—Mr. McEwen rose in his place, and said that he proposed to move the adjournment of the House for the purpose of discussing a definite matter of urgent public importance, namely, "Whether an offence against the security of the Commonwealth has been committed by the publication of a map by an honorable Member of this House which appears to be:—

(a) a wrongful publication of an official military map, or

(b) the publication of a map which wrongfully purports to be a military map, or
(c) a map with no official basis which purports to show that large areas of the continent were to be evacuated and is calculated seriously to affect the morale of the people ".

Mr. Speaker thereupon called upon those Members who approved of the proposed discussion to rise in their places, and more than the necessary number of Members having risen accordingly—

Mr. McEwen moved, That the House do now adjourn.

Debate ensued.

Question—put and negatived.
