- 1. The House met, at half-past two o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker (the Honorable J. S. Rosevear) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2. ALTERATION OF HOUR OF NEXT MEETING.—Mr. Curtin (Prime Minister) moved, That the House, at its rising, adjourn until to-morrow at half-past ten o'clock a.m. Question—put and passed.
- 3. WITHDRAWAL OF NOTICE OF MOTION.—Sir Earle Page, by leave, withdrew Notice of Motion No. 2, General Business, standing in his name.
- 4. Adjournment-Motion for Purpose of Discussion.—Sir Earle Page rose in his place, and said that he proposed to move the adjournment of the House for the purpose of discussing a definite matter of urgent public importance, namely, "The provision of further assistance to enable the dairying industry to meet all its additional burdens including those imposed by war conditions and the findings of the Federal Arbitration Court".

Mr. Speaker thereupon called upon those Members who approved of the proposed discussion to rise in their places, and more than the necessary number of Members having risen accordingly-

Sir Earle Page moved, That the House do now adjourn.

Ordered—That Mr. Pollard be granted an extension of time.

Debate continued.

Closure.-Mr. Curtin (Prime Minister) moved, That the question be now put.

Question—That the question be now put—put and passed.

And the question—That the House do now adjourn—was put accordingly, and negatived.

Income Tax Assessment Bill 1944.—The Order of the Day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question, That the Bill be now read a second time—And on the Amendment moved thereto by Mr. Holt, viz.:—That all words after "That" be omitted with a view to inserting the following words in place thereof:—"this House, while favouring the principle of basing income taxation on current earnings, is of opinion that the Bill should be withdrawn and redrafted to eliminate those provisions which impose an additional burden of 25 per cent. of taxation by requiring taxpayers to pay, in addition to a current year's tax, a further levy of 25 per cent. based on incomes earned in the year 1943-44"-

Debate resumed.

Debate ensued.

Progress to be reported, and leave asked to sit again.

The House resumed; Mr. Riordan reported accordingly.

Resolved—That the House will, at the next sitting, again resolve itself into the said Committee.

7. ADJOURNMENT.—Mr. Forde (Minister for the Army) moved, That the House do now adjourn. Debate ensued.

Question—put and passed.

And then the House, at fifteen minutes past two o'clock in the morning, adjourned until this day at half-past ten o'clock a.m.
