- 1. The House met, at twelve o'clock noon, pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker (the Honorable J. S. Rosevear) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2. CLEMENCY TOWARDS OFFENDERS AGAINST LAWS OF COMMONWEALTH AND TERRITORIES—MINISTERIAL STATEMENT.—Mr. Chifley (Prime Minister), by leave, made a Ministerial Statement informing the House that His Royal Highness the Governor-General had been pleased to mark the occasion of the formal surrender of Japan by exercising elemency towards offenders against the laws of the Commonwealth and Territories.
