## THURSDAY, 28TH NOVEMBER, 1946.

- 1. The House met, at half-past two o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker (the Honorable J. S. Rosevear) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2. RETIREMENT OF PRINCIPAL PARLIAMENTARY REPORTER.—Mr. Speaker informed the House of the retirement on the 30th November of Mr. G. H. Romans, Principal Parliamentary Reporter, and referred to the service rendered to Parliament by this officer.
  - Mr. Chifley (Prime Minister), Mr. Menzies (Leader of the Opposition) and Mr. Fadden also addressed the House in similar terms.
- 3. Nominations for Appointment as Governor-General-Statements.-Mr. Menzics (Leader of the Opposition), by leave, made a Statement with reference to the principles which should apply in selecting persons to be nominated for appointment as Governor-General.
  - Mr. Fadden and Mr. Chifley (Prime Minister), by leave, also made Statements with reference to the matter.

- 5. ALIEN IMMIGRANTS FROM MIDDLE EAST-MOTION FOR TABLING PAPERS.-Mr. Lang moved, pursuant to notice, That there be laid upon the Table of the House-
  - (a) the papers relating to the entry of 200 alien immigrants who arrived from the Middle East on the Strathmore,
  - (b) the original applications for permission to enter, together with the recommendations thereon, and
  - (c) the text of the representations made through Australia House to the British Ministry of Transport which led to the withholding of 200 berths from passengers stranded in England in order to accommodate migrants from the Middle East.

It being two hours after the time fixed for the meeting of the House, the Orders of the Day, Government Business, were called on, in accordance with Standing Order No. 119.

Point of Order.—Mr. Lang raised a Point of Order that, as General Business has precedence until 9 o'clock p.m., and, as there are no Orders of the Day, General Business, the debate on the Notice

of Motion, General Business, should proceed.

Speaker's Ruling.—Mr. Speaker ruled that Standing Order No. 119 provides that if all motions shall not have been disposed of two hours after the time fixed for the meeting of the House, the Orders

of the Day shall be taken, unless the House otherwise orders.

Ordered—That the debate be now adjourned, and that the resumption of the debate be made an Order of the Day for Thursday, 19th December.

6. Members Named and Suspended.—Mr. Speaker named the honorable Member for Wentworth (Mr. Harrison) for not withdrawing an unparliamentary expression and apologizing when requested by the Chair to do so.

Mr. Speaker named the honorable Member for Richmond (Mr. Anthony) for disregarding the authority of the Chair.

Mr. Dedman (Minister for Defence) moved, That the honorable Member for Wentworth and the honorable Member for Richmond be suspended from the service of the House.

8. Supply—Budget Debate.—The House, according to Order, resolved itself into the Committee of Supply.
