Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act, the Minister administering the Australian Soldiers' Repatriation Act 1920-1946 and the Minister administering the War Service Homes Act 1918-1946 may appoint a returned soldier to any position in such Department as he considers such soldier competent and qualified to fill."
