- 1. The House met, at three o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment.-Mr. Speaker (the Honorable J. S. Rosevear) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2. Prisoners of War-Subsistence Allowance-Statement by Member.-Mr. Cameron, by leave, made a Statement informing the House that the matter of paying a subsistence allowance to prisoners of war was not one referred to or considered by the Committee of Senators and Members of the House of Representatives appointed to inquire into and report on methods of recognition of the services of the Fighting Forces.
- 3. FOODSTUFFS FOR THE UNITED KINGDOM-USE OF TANK LANDING SHIPS-STATEMENT BY MEMBER. Mr. Howse, by leave, made a Statement with reference to a proposal that tank landing ships, manned by volunteer crews, should be used to carry foodstuffs to the United Kingdom.
- 4. Message from the Governor-General.-Assent to Bill.-The following Message from His Excellency the Governor-General was received, and was read by Mr. Speaker:

Remaining clauses, by leave, taken as a whole and agreed to.

Title agreed to.

Bill to be reported with an amendment.

On the motion of Mr. Evatt, by leave, the House adopted the Report, and, by leave, the Bill was read a third time.

8. Ways and Means-Stevedoring Industry Charge.-The House, according to Order, resolved itself into the Committee of Ways and Means.

Resolution to be reported, and leave asked to sit again.

The House resumed; Mr. Clark reported accordingly.

Resolved—That the House will, at a later hour this day, again resolve itself into the said Committee. Mr. Evatt moved, pursuant to contingent notice, That so much of the Standing Orders be suspended as would prevent the remaining stages being passed without delay.

Question—put and passed.

The Resolution reported from the Committee was read, and, on the motion of Mr. Evatt, was adopted by the House.

Ordered-That Mr. Evatt and Mr. Chifley do prepare and bring in a Bill to carry out the foregoing Resolution.

9. Stevedoring Industry Charge Bill 1947.-Mr. Evatt (Attorney-General) then brought up a Bill intituled "A Bill for an Act to impose a Charge in respect of the Employment of Waterside Workers", and moved, That it be now read a first time.

Question—put and passed.—Bill read a first time.

Mr. Evatt moved, That the Bill be now read a second time.

Question—put and passed.—Bill read a second time.

Mr. Speaker left the Chair, and the House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole.

(In the Committee.)

Bill, by leave, taken as a whole, and agreed to.

Bill to be reported without amendment.

The House resumed; Mr. Clark reported accordingly.

On the motion of Mr. Evatt, the House adopted the Report, and the Bill was read a third time.

10. POSTPONEMENT OF ORDER OF THE DAY. -Ordered -That Order of the Day No. 3, Government Business, be postponed until a later hour this day.

11. APPLE AND PEAR ORGANIZATION BILL 1947.—The Order of the Day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question, That the Bill be now read a second time—

Mr. Pollard (Minister for Commerce and Agriculture) moved, That the debate be now adjourned. Question—That the debate be now adjourned—put and passed.

Ordered-That the resumption of the debate be made an Order of the Day for the next sitting.

 ADJOURNMENT.—Mr. Chifley (Prime Minister) moved, That the House do now adjourn. Debate ensued. Question—put and passed.

And then the House, at twenty minutes past ten o'clock p.m., adjourned until to-morrow at half-past two o'clock p.m.
