5. International Trade and Tariff Negotiations—Ministerial Statement.—Mr. Dedman (Minister for Post-war Reconstruction), by leave, made a Ministerial Statement informing the House of the result of the recent negotiations at Geneva and of the provisional application by the Government of the draft agreement on tariffs and trade.

Mr. Menzies (Leader of the Opposition), Mr. McEwen and Mr. Chifley (Prime Minister), by leave, also made Statements with reference to the matter.
