- The House met, at half-past ten o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker (the Honorable J. S. Rosevear) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2. Petitions.—Petitions, praying that no further steps should be taken by the Government towards the nationalization of the banking system without first seeking the authority of the Australian people, were presented as under:—
 - By Mr. Adermann, from certain electors of the Division of Maranoa, and
 - By Mr. Anthony, from certain electors of the Division of Richmond.

Petitions severally received and read.

- 3. Paper.—The following Paper was presented, pursuant to Statute—Commonwealth Bank Act—Appointment—H. A. Butler.
- 4. WAR SERVICE HOMES BILL (No. 2) 1947.—Mr. Lemmon (Minister for Works and Housing) moved, pursuant to notice, That he have leave to bring in a Bill for an Act to amend the War Service Homes Act 1918-1946, as amended by the Commonwealth Public Service Act 1947 and the War Service Homes Act 1947.

Question—put and passed.

- 5. Postponement of Order of the Day.—Ordered—That Order of the Day No. 1 be postponed until after Order of the Day No. 2, Government Business.
- 6. Banking Bill 1947.—The Order of the Day having been read for the further consideration of this Bill in Committee of the whole House— Mr. Speaker left the Chair, and the House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole.

(In the Committee.)

Clauses 9 to 25 further debated.

Mr. Menzies (Leader of the Opposition) moved, as an amendment, That after "Gazette" (clause 13, page 4, line 35) the words "not earlier than one month after this Act comes into operation" be inserted.

Debate continued.
