MARRIAGE OF THE PRINCESS ELIZABETH-REPLY TO JOINT ADDRESS TO HIS MAJESTY THE KING.-Mr. Speaker informed the House that he had received from His Excellency the Governor-General the following reply by His Majesty The King to the Joint Address presented on the occasion of the marriage of Her Royal Highness The Princess Elizabeth :---

4. AUSTRALIAN SOLDIERS' REPATRIATION BILL (No. 2) 1947.-The Order of the Day having been read

Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act, the administration and distribution of an existing patriotic fund shall not be taken out of the hands of the organization controlling the fund unless that organization has notified the Minister that it desires to relinquish the administration of the fund.".
