- 2. RETIREMENT OF MR. K. BINNS, PARLIAMENTARY LIBRARIAN.—Mr. Speaker informed the House of the impending retirement of Mr. K. Binns, Parliamentary Librarian, and expressed appreciation of the valuable service rendered to the Parliament by Mr. Binus during his 36 years' service. Mr. Chifley (Prime Minister), Mr. Menzies (Leader of the Opposition), Mr. Fadden and Mr. Blain,

by leave, also addressed the House in similar terms.

- 3. Suspension of Standing Order No. 70.—Mr. Chifley (Prime Minister) moved, pursuant to notice, That Standing Order No. 70 (eleven o'clock rule) be suspended until the end of next week. Question-put and passed.
