- The House met, at half-past ten o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker (the Honorable J. S. Rosevear) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2. ALTERATION OF HOUR OF NEXT MEETING.—Mr. Chifley (Prime Minister) moved, That the House, at its rising, adjourn until to-morrow at half-past ten o'clock a.m. Question—put and passed.
- 3. Call to Speak—Statement by Member.—Mr. Holt, by leave, made a Statement regarding his desire, at the previous sitting, to speak to the motion for the adjournment of the House.
- 4. Member Named and Suspended.—Mr. Speaker named the honorable Member for Richmond (Mr. Anthony) for disregarding the authority of the Chair.

 Mr. Chifley (Prime Minister) moved, That the honorable Member for Richmond be suspended from the

service of the House.

Question—put.
The House divided (The Speaker, Mr. Rosevear, in the Chair)—

And so it was resolved in the affirmative.

The honorable Member was, therefore, under Standing Order No. 59, suspended for a week, this being his second occasion of suspension, and he accordingly withdrew from the Chamber.

5. Public Works Committee—Report.—Mr. Rankin (Vice-Chairman) brought up the following Report from the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Public Works:

6. Ansett Airways Pty. Ltd.—Fares—Ministerial Statement—Motion for Printing Paper.— Mr. Drakeford (Minister for Civil Aviation), by leave, made a Ministerial Statement informing the House of certain facts relating to the fares charged or to be charged by Ansett Airways Pty. Ltd., and, by command of His Excellency the Governor-General, laid upon the Table the following Paper:-

Mr. Holloway then brought up the Bill accordingly, and moved, That it be now read a first time.

Question—put and passed.—Bill read a first time.

Mr. Holloway moved, by leave, That the Bill be now read a second time.

Mr. Menzies (Leader of the Opposition) moved, That the debate be now adjourned.

Question—That the debate be now adjourned—put and passed.

Ordered—That the resumption of the debate be made an Order of the Day for a later hour this day.

10. Public Works Committee—Reference of Work—Tribophysics Laboratory, Melbourne. Mr. Lemmon (Minister for Works and Housing) moved, pursuant to notice, That, in accordance with the provisions of the Commonwealth Public Works Committee Act 1913-1936, the following proposed work be referred to the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Public Works for investigation and report, namely:—Erection of Tribophysics Laboratory at Melbourne University, for the Council for Scientific and Industrial Research.

Allegations of Wrongful Use of Parliamentary Privileges by Member for the Northern TERRITORY—INQUIRY BY COMMITTEE OF PRIVILEGES.—Mr. McEwen moved, pursuant to notice, That the Committee of Privileges be convened to inquire into the allegations made by the honorable Member for Lang as to the wrongful use by the honorable Member for the Northern Territory, whilst a prisoner of war in the hands of the Japanese, of his Parliamentary privileges; and that, for the purposes of this inquiry, the Committee shall have power to call witnesses on oath and inspect official documents. .:: :

Debate ensued,

Mr. Menzies (Leader of the Opposition) moved, as an amendment, That all words after "That" be omitted with a view to inserting the following words in place thereof:-" the House, having heard statements in relation to certain allegations made against the honorable Member for the Northern Territory, declares its opinion-

(a) that the conduct of the said honorable Member whilst a prisoner of war in the hands of the Japanese was marked by courage and fidelity, and

(b) that the said honorable Member while a prisoner as aforesaid did not wrongfully use his Parliamentary privileges.".

Question—That the words proposed to be omitted stand part of the question—put.

Mr. Ryan moved, as an amendment, That sub-clause (8.) be omitted.

Amendment negatived.

Clause agreed to.

Clause 10 debated and agreed to.

Clauses 11 and 12 agreed to.

Clause 13 debated and agreed to.

Clauses 14 to 16 agreed to.

Clause 17 debated and agreed to.

Clauses 18 to 24 agreed to.

Title agreed to.

Bill to be reported with an amendment.

The House resumed; Mr. Clark reported accordingly.

On the motion of Mr. Pollard (Minister for Commerce and Agriculture), by leave, the House adopted the Report, and, by leave, the Bill was read a third time.

16. Ways and Means-Egg Export Charges.-The House, according to Order, resolved itself into the Committee of Ways and Means.

(In the Committee.)

Mr. Pollard (Minister for Commerce and Agriculture) moved-

(1) That, subject to lower rates of charges being prescribed by regulations made, and subject to exemptions allowed under order made, under the Act passed to give effect to this Resolution, charges be imposed at the rates specified in the following Schedule on all eggs (being hen eggs in shell and including the following products of hen eggs, namely, liquid whole egg, liquid egg white, liquid egg yolk, dried whole egg, sugared dried egg and dried egg white) exported from the Commonwealth after a date to be fixed by Proclamation under that Act :=

. (2) That the charges imposed in pursuance of this Resolution shall cease to be imposed upon a date fixed by Proclamation under the Act passed to give effect to this Resolution as the date upon which that Act shall cease to be in force.

Question—put and passed.

Resolution to be reported, and leave asked to sit again.

The House resumed; Mr. Clark reported accordingly.

Resolved—That the House will, at a later hour this day, again resolve itself into the said Committee. Mr. Pollard moved, pursuant to contingent notice, That so much of the Standing Orders be suspended as would prevent the remaining stages being passed without delay.
