- 1. The House met, at half-past two o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker (the Honorable J. S. Rosevear) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2. NATIONAL POPULATION POLICY.—Dame Enid Lyons moved, pursuant to notice—

(1) That the formulation of a comprehensive national population policy can no longer be delayed, in view of Australia's responsibilities to herself and her relation to the outside world.

(2) That while neglecting no phase of the problem, whether social, psychological, economic or racial, such a policy, having regard to the general decline in the birth-rate, must place first emphasis upon the welfare of Australian women and children and the promotion of family life.

Debate ensued.

It being two hours after the time fixed for the meeting of the House, the debate was interrupted in accordance with Standing Order No. 119.

Mr. Calwell (Minister for Immigration) was granted leave to continue his speech when the debate is resumed.

(d) the unbalanced native policy and its adverse effect upon the natives and upon economic

development; and

(e) the unrest which exists in the Public Service in the Territories due to unsettled conditions and the failure of the Government to provide suitable living conditions, adequate classification and to deal with the high cost of living—
