6. COMMONWEALTH ELECTORAL BILL 1948.—Mr. Evatt (Attorney-General), pursuant to leave given on the 14th April, brought up a Bill intituled "A Bill for an Act to amend the 'Commonwealth Electoral Act 1918-1946' and the 'Senate Elections Act 1903-1922'", and moved, That it be now read a first time.

Question—put and passed.—Bill read a first time. Mr. Evatt moved, by leave, That the Bill be now read a second time.

Mr. Menzies (Leader of the Opposition) moved, That the debate be now adjourned.

Question—That the debate be now adjourned—put and passed. Ordered—That the resumption of the debate be made an Order of the Day for the next sitting.

7. ADJOURNMENT.-Mr. Holloway (Minister for Labour and National Service) moved, That the House do now adjourn.

Question---put and passed.
