3. PASSPORTS BILL 1948.—Mr. Calwell (Minister for Immigration) moved, pursuant to notice, That he have leave to bring in a Bill for an Act to amend the Passports Act 1938. Question-put and passed.

Mr. Calwell then brought up the Bill accordingly, and moved, That it be now read a first time. Question—put and passed.—Bill read a first time. Ordered—That the second reading be made an Order of the Day for the next sitting.

4. IMMIGRATION (GUARDIANSHIP OF CHILDREN) BILL 1948 .- The Order of the Day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question, That the Bill be now read a second time --Debate resumed.

Question—put and passed.—Bill read a second time. Mr. Deputy Speaker left the Chair, and the House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole.

Bill, by leave, taken as a whole, and agreed to. Bill to be reported without amendment.

On the motion of Mr. Calwell (Minister for Immigration), the House adopted the Report, and, by leave, the Bill was read a third time.

 - Debate resumed by Mr. White who moved, as an amendment, That all words after "That" be omitted with a view to inserting the following words in place thereof :---" the Bill be withdrawn and redrafted to provide that nothing in the proposed Act shall in any way restrict the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia from giving preferential tariff concessions to goods manufactured in the United Kingdom or in other countries of the British Empire and Commonwealth ". Debate continued.

Mr. Adermann moved, That the debate be now adjourned.

Question-That the debate be now adjourned-put and passed.
