- 2. ADJOURNMENT-MOTION FOR PURPOSE OF DISCUSSION.—Mr. Turnbull rose in his place, and said that he proposed to move the adjournment of the House for the purpose of discussing a definite matter of urgent public importance, namely, "The increasing menace of the rabbit pest to production and the stability of the national economy, the extent to which the Government's centralization policy is a contributing factor, the Government's inability or unwillingness to recognize the extent of the danger, and the Government's attitude of regarding the pest as an industry"

Mr. Speaker thereupon called upon those Members who approved of the proposed discussion to rise in their places, and more than the necessary number of Members having risen accordingly—

Mr. Turnbull moved, That the House do now adjourn.

Debate ensued.
