Aircraft Accident, Bilinga-Ministerial Statement.-Mr. Drakeford (Minister for Civil Aviation), by leave, made a Ministerial Statement with reference to the accident which occurred this morning at the Bilinga aerodrome, near Coolangatta, to a Lockheed Lodestar aircraft, operated by Queensland Airlines.

The Senate returns to the House of Representatives the Bill for "An Act to approve the placing of the Territory of New Guinea under the International Trusteeship System, to provide for the Government of the Territory of Papua and the Territory of New Guinea, and for other purposes", and acquaints the House that the Senate has agreed to the Bill with the Amendments indicated by the annexed Schedule, in which Amendments the Senate requests the concurrence of the House of Representatives.
