Sir Earle Page moved, as an amendment, That the words "two Associate Commissioners, each of whom shall be appointed by the Governor-General" (page 3, lines 1 and 2) be omitted with a view to inserting the following words in place thereof:—"three Associate Commissioners who shall be appointed by the Governor of New South Wales, the Governor of Victoria and the Governor of South Australia, respectively".

"(d) grant compensation for such land, to be paid for at present day values, plus a minimum of twenty per centum, for forced resumption, within twelve months of entry".

Clause agreed to.

Clause 21 agreed to.

Clause 22-

Mr. Beale moved, as an amendment, That the following proviso be added to sub-clause (4.):—

"Provided that the Minister is satisfied that the person proposed to be appointed is not a Communist or a person likely to act in any way inimical to the interests of the Commonwealth.".

Debate ensued.

Amendment negatived.

Clause agreed to.

Clauses 23 and 24 agreed to.

Clause 25—

Sir Earle Page moved, as an amendment, That after "Treasurer" (page 7, line 34) the words "and with the sanction of an appropriation by the Parliament" be added.

Debate ensued.

Question-That the words proposed to be added be so added-put.
