PART VA.—APPLICATION TO OVERSEA SHIPS ENGAGED IN THE COASTING TRADE.

79A. [This Part of this Act shall come into operation] on a day to be fixed by Proclamation not being less than six months after the commencement of this Act.

Amendment proposed—That the words “ This Part of this Act shall come into operation ” be omitted from the proposed new clause.

—(*Mr. Reid.*)Question—That the words proposed to be omitted stand part of the proposed new clause—put.
