TUESDAY, 8TH NOVEMBER, 1904.

1. The House met pursuant to adjournment.—Mr Speaker took the Chair, and read Prayers.
2. PAPERS.—Mr. Reid presented by command of His Excellency the Governor-General—  
 Sugar Bounty—Letter (dated 18th October, 1904) from the Premier of Queensland] to the Prime Minister, together with a Memorandum from Dr. Maxwell, Director of the Queensland Sugar Experiment Stations, &c.  
 Ordered to lie on the Table and to be printed.  
 The following Paper was laid upon the Table by the Clerk :—  
 “Stripper Harvesters.”—Return to an Order of the House, dated 27th October, 1904.
3. SUPPLY.—The House, according to Order, resolved itself into the Committee of Supply.  
 Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair; Mr. Salmon reported that the Committee had made progress, and that he was directed to ask, That the Committee may have leave to sit again.  
 Resolved—That the House will, to-morrow, again resolve itself into the said Committee.
4. ADJOURNMENT.—Mr. Reid moved, That the House do now adjourn.  
 Debate ensued.  
 Question—put and resolved in the affirmative.
