International Labour Organization Convention Equal Remuneration Ministerial Statement.—Mr. Holt (Minister for Labour and National Service), by leave, made a Ministerial Statement informing the House that a Report would be laid on the Table dealing with the action to be taken by the Government in regard to the Convention on equal remuneration adopted by the International Labour Organization at its thirty-fourth session, June, 1951.
