Mr. Evatt (Leader of the Opposition) moved the following amendment:— That clause 2 be omitted, and the following clause be inserted in place thereof:—

"2.—(1.) Save as to sections six, seven and eight, this Act shall come into operation on the day on which it receives the Royal Assent.

(2.) Sections six, seven and eight shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by Proclamation but not before the expiration of fourteen days after the receipt by the Minister of the Report made under section eleven of this Act by the Committee of Inquiry.".
Debate ensued.
