WEDNESDAY, 3RD OCTOBER, 1956.

1. The House met, at half-past two o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker (the Honorable J. McLeay) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
2. STATEMENT BY MEMBER—LEAVE TO MAKE NOT GRANTED.—Mr. C. R. Cameron asked leave to make a Statement.  
Objection being raised, leave not granted.
3. PAPERS.—The following Papers were presented, pursuant to Statute—  
Dried Fruits Export Control Act—Dried Fruits Control Board—Thirty-second Annual Report, for year 1955-56, together with Statement by Minister regarding the operation of the Act.  
Public Service Act—Appointments—Department—Interior—H. R. F. Gollnow.  
National Development—D. R. Woolley.  
Public Service Arbitration Act—Determination—1956—No. 90—Amalgamated Postal Workers' Union of Australia.  
Wine Overseas Marketing Act—Australian Wine Board—Twenty-eighth Annual Report, for year 1955-56, together with Statement by Minister regarding the operation of the Act.
4. PRECEDENCE TO GOVERNMENT BUSINESS.—Mr. H. E. Holt (Minister for Labour and National Service) moved, pursuant to notice, That Government Business shall take precedence over General Business to-morrow.  
Question—put and passed.
5. SUPPLY—ESTIMATES 1956-57.—The House, according to Order, resolved itself into the Committee of Supply.

Votes debated and agreed to.  
Progress to be reported, and leave asked to sit again.

The House resumed ; Mr. Adermann reported accordingly.  
Resolved—That the House will, at the next sitting, again resolve itself into the said Committee.

6. ADJOURNMENT.—Mr. H. E. Holt (Minister for Labour and National Service) moved, That the House do now adjourn.  
Question—put and passed.

And then the House, at twenty-nine minutes to twelve o'clock midnight, adjourned until to-morrow at half-past ten o'clock a.m.
