DISCUSSION OF MATTER OF URGENCY—WHEAT TRANSPORT SUBSIDIES.—Mr. Haylen having proposed to Mr. Speaker that a definite matter of urgent public importance be submitted to the House for discussion, namely, "The failure of the Commonwealth Government to provide necessary and reasonable subsidies on the transport of wheat in order to deal with the crisis in the wheat industry and prevent the price of bread and other wheaten foods being increased"—

Mr. Haylen addressed the House.
