Page 14, after paragraph (b) insert the following paragraphs:—

(ba) any sum in respect of a pension, social service benefit or repatriation benefit paid or payable, consequent upon the death or injury, by any government or person;

"(bb) in the case of death, any sum in respect of the acquisition by a spouse or child of the deceased, consequent upon the death, of, or of an interest in, a dwelling used at any time as the home of that spouse or child, or of, or of an interest in, the household contents of any such dwelling; or ".

Clauses 39 and 40, by leave, taken together, and agreed to.

Clause 41-

On the motion of Mr. Townley, the following amendment was made, after debate:—

Page 15, line 23, at the end of the clause add the following:—

", but so that no adaptation or modification of the provisions of Article 22 of the Warsaw Convention, as replaced by Article XI. of the Hague Protocol, shall have the effect of limiting the liability of the carrier to a sum less than the sum to which his liability would be limited if those provisions were applied without adaptation or modification."

Clause, as amended, agreed to.

Remainder of Bill, by leave, taken as a whole, and agreed to.

Bill to be reported with amendments.

The House resumed; Mr. Lucock reported accordingly.

On the motion of Mr. Townley, by leave, the House adopted the Report, and, by leave, the Bill was read a third time.
