- 2. Petitions.—Mr. Johnson presented a Petition from certain citizens of Australia praying that immediate consideration be given to the matter of increasing the rate of age, invalid and widows' pensions to at least 50 per cent, of the basic wage.

Petition received and read.

A similiar Petition was presented by Mr. Opperman, and was received.

Mr. Johnson presented a Petition from certain citizens of Australia praying that the House will (1) give immediate consideration to the matter of increasing the rate of age, invalid and widows' pensions to at least 50 per cent. of the basic wage, (2) amend the National Health Act to make the Pensioner Medical Service available to all pensioners irrespective of means, and (3) provide increased pharmaceutical benefits for pensioners.

Petition received and read.

3. FOREIGN AFFAIRS---VISIT ABROAD OF PRIME MINISTER---MINISTERIAL STATEMENT---MOTION FOR PRINTING PAPER.-Mr. Menzies (Prime Minister), by leave, made a Ministerial Statement on foreign affairs with particular reference to his recent visit abroad, and, by command of His Excellency the Governor-General, laid upon the Table the following Paper:-
