The House resumed; Mr. Bowden reported accordingly.

Ordered—That the House will, at the next sitting, again resolve itself into the said Committee.

9. ADJOURNMENT.—Mr. Davidson (Postmaster-General) moved, That the House do now adjourn. Debate ensued.

Question-put and passed.

And then the House, at fourteen minutes to twelve o'clock midnight, adjourned until to-morrow at half-past ten o'clock a.m.
