- 6. DEATH OF PARAMOUNT RULER OF MALAYA.—Mr. Menzies (Prime Minister) informed the House of the death that morning of His Majesty the Paramount Ruler of Malaya and stated that he felt sure he would have the complete approval of the House if he were to communicate its genuine feeling and sympathy to the Prime Minister and Government of Malaya in the great loss sustained by that country. Mr. Calwell (Leader of the Opposition) supported the remarks of the Prime Minister and expressed the desire of the Opposition to be fully associated in the message of sympathy.
