1. The House met, at half-past two o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker (the Honorable J. McLeay) took the Chair, and read Prayers.

4. SEAMEN'S WAR PENSIONS AND ALLOWANCES BILL 1960.—The Order of the Day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question, That the Bill be now read a second time—
  - Debate resumed by Mr. Haylen who moved, as an amendment, That all words after " That " be omitted with a view to inserting the following words in place thereof:—" the Bill be withdrawn and redrafted to provide for an appropriate allowance—
    - (a) to a remarried widow of an Australian mariner whose death has been accepted for purposes of section twelve of the Act who is again widowed, and
    - (b) to the parent or parents of such an Australian mariner "

Clauses 1 to 4 agreed to.

Proposed new clause—

Mr. Haylen moved, That the following new clause be inserted in the Bill:—

“2A. Section fifty-nine of the Principal Act is amended by inserting after paragraph (g) the following paragraph:—

‘(ga) medical benefits for the wives of Australian mariners who have suffered war injuries, being benefits similar to those for which they would be eligible if they were the wives of pensioners eligible for medical benefits under the Pensioner Medical Service;’.”

Debate ensued.

Vote—"Department of Civil Aviation, £12,401,000"—

Vote—"Department of Shipping and Transport, £1,306,000"—

Votes together debated.

Progress to be reported, and leave asked to sit again.

The House resumed; Mr. Bowden reported accordingly.

Ordered—That the House will, at the next sitting, again resolve itself into the said Committee.

6. ADJOURNMENT.—Mr. Opperman (Minister for Shipping and Transport) moved, That the House do now adjourn.

Question—put and passed.

And then the House, at eighteen minutes to eleven o'clock p.m., adjourned until to-morrow at half-past two o'clock p.m.
