Explanatory Note on Form of Budget Documents

Consequent upon amendments to the Standing Orders of the House of Representatives agreed to on 1st May, 1963, changes were made to the form of the Budget documents presented to Parliament. The documents, in their new form, first appeared in conjunction with the Budget presented on 13th August, 1963.

The annual appropriations, which prior to 1963, were included in the document *Estimates of Receipts and Expenditure* are now set out in the Second Schedules of the Appropriation Bills. The estimates of receipts and summaries of estimated expenditure from the Consolidated Revenue Fund (including Special Appropriations), and the Loan Fund, are now contained in a new document *Estimates of Receipts and Summary of Estimated Expenditure*.

In order to avoid duplication, the papers issued prior to 1963 under the title of *The Budget* were discontinued. The tables of "Government Securities on Issue" which appeared as Part IV, and "Income Tax Statistics" which appeared in Part V of *The Budget*, are now printed as separate documents. Other statistics are made available to Senators and Members in the *Commonwealth Finance* bulletin prepared by the Commonwealth Statistician. This bulletin is not, however, presented to Parliament or published as a Parliamentary Paper.

An expanded index, attached to the *Estimates of Receipts and Summary of Estimated Expenditure* paper, provides a reference to the information in that document, in the Appropriation Bills and in the other financial documents presented with the Budget by the Treasurer.
