- 1. The House met, at half-past ten o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment.--Mr. Speaker (the Honorable Sir John McLeay) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2. PETITION.-Mr. Reynolds presented a Petition from certain electors in the State of New South Wales praying that the House will (1) make provision in the Budget for a substantial Federal emergency grant to all State Governments for education services and (2) set up a national committee of enquiry to investigate and report on the needs of primary, secondary and technical education throughout Australia.
