### THURSDAY, 18th OCTOBER, 1962.

- 1. The House met, at half-past ten o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker (the Honorable Sir John McLeay) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2. QUESTIONS.—Questions without notice were answered.
- 3. Answers to Questions on Notice—Ministerial Statement.—Sir Garfield Barwick (Minister for External Affairs), by leave, made a Ministerial Statement regarding his policy when answering questions on notice.

Mr. Whitlam and Mr. Daly, by leave, also made Statements with reference to the matter.

4. Suspension of Standing Orders—Extended Time for Speeches.—Mr. Townley (Minister for Defence) moved, by leave, That so much of the Standing Orders be suspended as would prevent Mr. McEwen (Minister for Trade) and Mr. Calwell (Leader of the Opposition) each speaking on the motion to print the Ministerial Statement on the Prime Ministers' Conference and the Common Market for a period not exceeding 45 minutes.

Question-put and passed.

- 5. Paper.—The following Paper was presented, pursuant to Statute—Stevedoring Industry Act—Australian Stevedoring Industry Authority—Report and financial statements, together with the Auditor-General's Report, for year 1961-62.
- 6. Ways and Means ["Grievance Day" and Income Tax and Social Services Contribution].—Pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order No. 291, the Order of the Day having been read for going into the Committee of Ways and Means—

Question—That the Speaker do now leave the Chair—put and passed.

Whereupon Mr. Speaker left the Chair, and the House resolved itself into the Committee of Ways and Means.

(In the Committee.)

Consideration resumed of the motion moved by Mr. Holt (Treasurer) on the 9th October, 1962 (see pages 232-235).

Motion agreed to.

Resolution to be reported, and leave asked to sit again.

The House resumed; Mr. Lucock reported accordingly.

Ordered—That the House will, at a later hour this day, again resolve itself into the said Committee.

Mr. Townley (Minister for Defence) moved, pursuant to contingent notice, That so much of the Standing Orders be suspended as would prevent the remaining stages being passed without delay.

Question—put and passed.

On the motion of Mr. Townley, the Resolution reported from the Committee was adopted by the House. Ordered—That Mr. Townley and Mr. Swartz do prepare and bring in a Bill to carry out the foregoing Resolution.

7. Income Tax and Social Services Contribution Bill 1962.—Mr. Townley (Minister for Defence) then brought up a Bill intituled A Bill for an Act to impose upon Incomes a Tax by the name of Income Tax and Social Services Contribution.

Bill read a first time.

Mr. Townley moved, That the Bill be now read a second time.

Mr. Crean moved, as an amendment, That all words after "That" be omitted with a view to inserting the following words in place thereof:—"this House condemns this proposal which although it provides for a five per cent. reduction of taxation, does so on an inequitable flat rate basis which fails to extend an adequate share of the reduction to taxpayers with dependants and taxpayers with small incomes, and is of opinion that legislation to correct this injustice should be introduced immediately".

Debate continued.

Question—That the words proposed to be omitted stand part of the question—put.
