- 1. The House met, at half-past ten o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker (the Honorable Sir John McLeay) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- PETITION.—Mr. Barnard presented a Petition from certain electors of the Division of Bass praying that the Government will immediately move to replace the present obsolete and inadequate Post Office building at Newstead in Tasmania. Petition received and read.
- 3. QUESTIONS.—Questions without notice were answered.
- 4. PAPERS—LEAVE TO TABLE NOT GRANTED.—Mr. Wentworth asked leave to lay upon the Table certain Papers. Objection being raised, leave not granted.
- 5. PAPER.—The following Paper was presented, pursuant to Statute— Customs Act—Regulations—Statutory Rules 1962, No. 103.
- 6. DISCUSSION OF MATTER OF URGENCY—COMMONWEALTH DEVELOPMENT BANK AND HIRE-PURCHASE NEEDS.—Mr. Speaker informed the House that Mr. A. D. Fraser had proposed that a definite matter of urgent public importance be submitted to the House for discussion, namely, "The need, demonstrated by the iniquitous practices of some private companies, for the Commonwealth Development Bank to enter fully into the hire-purchase field at all levels to enable people to obtain such finance for their needs on reasonable terms and conditions".
 - The proposed discussion having received the necessary support—
 - Mr. Fraser addressed the House.
 - Discussion ensued.
 - Discussion concluded.
- 7. SUSPENSION OF STANDING ORDERS—BILLS RELATING TO REPATRIATION.—Mr. Downer (Minister for Immigration) moved, pursuant to notice, That, in relation to the proceedings on the following Bills, viz.:—Repatriation (Special Overseas Service) Bill 1962, Repatriation (Far East Strategic Reserve) Bill 1962, Repatriation Bill (No. 2) 1962, Re-establishment and Employment Bill 1962, War Service Homes Bill (No. 2) 1962, Commonwealth Employees' Compensation Bill 1962, Social Services Bill (No. 2) 1962, Broadcasting and Television Bill 1962, Estate Duty Assessment Bill 1962 and Income Tax and Social Services Contribution Assessment Bill (No. 2) 1962, so much of the Standing Orders be suspended as would prevent—
 - (a) one motion being moved without delay and one question being put in regard to, respectively, the introduction, the first readings, the second readings, the Committee's report stage, and the third readings, of all the Bills together, and
 - (b) the consideration of all the Bills as a whole together in a Committee of the Whole.

Mallon, the Commissioners appointed for the purpose of distributing the said State into Divisions, in their Report laid before the House of Representatives on the 4th day of October,

PART I.-LEVY ON CERTAIN HONEY PRODUCED IN AUSTRALIA AND SOLD.

1.--(1.) That, subject to the next succeeding sub-paragraph, a levy be imposed on honey that is sold on or after a date to be fixed by the Minister by notice in the Gazette, being honey-

- (a) produced in Australia on or after that date; or
 - (b) produced in Australia before that date and remaining in the ownership of the producer immediately before that date.

(2.) That the levy be not imposed by reason of a sale of honey if-

- (a) levy has been imposed in accordance with this Part on the honey by reason of a previous sale of the honey;
- (b) the honey is, under the contract of sale-
 - (i) to be delivered to a place outside Australia; or

(ii) to be placed on board a ship or aircraft for export from Australia;

- (c) the vendor is the producer of the honey and the purchaser is a person whose name is included in the list of Honey Dealers proposed to be maintained under the Act passed to give effect to Honey Levy Collection Bill 1962; or
- (d) the purchaser gives to the vendor a certificate, in accordance with a form to be prescribed by regulations, of the purchaser's intention to export the honey, and neither the vendor nor any other person has, with respect to a previous sale of the honey, given such a certificate.

2.-(1.) That, subject to the next succeeding sub-paragraph, the rate of the levy be one-half penny per pound of honey.

(2.) That regulations may, from time to time, prescribe a rate, not exceeding one penny per pound, in lieu of the rate specified in the last preceding sub-paragraph.

(3.) That, before making or repealing regulations prescribing a rate of the levy, the Governor-General be required to take into consideration any recommendation with respect to the rate made to the Minister by the Australian Honey Board.

3. That, where, by reason of a sale of honey, levy is imposed on the honey, the levy be payable by the vendor.

PART II.-LEVY ON CERTAIN HONEY PRODUCED IN AUSTRALIA AND USED IN THE PRODUCTION OF OTHER GOODS.

4. That a levy be imposed on honey (not being honey on which levy has been imposed by the Act passed to give effect to Part I. of this Resolution) that, on or after a date to be fixed by the Minister by notice in the Gazette, is used by a person in the production of other goods, being honey-

(a) produced in Australia on or after that date; or

(b) produced in Australia before that date and remaining in the ownership of the producer immediately before that date.

5.-(1.) That, subject to the next succeeding sub-paragraph, the rate of the levy be one-half penny per pound of honey.

(2.) That regulations may, from time to time, prescribe a rate, not exceeding one penny per pound, in lieu of the rate specified in the last preceding sub-paragraph.

(3.) That, before making or repealing regulations prescribing a rate of the levy, the Governor-General be required to take into consideration any recommendation with respect to the rate made to the Minister by the Australian Honey Board.

6. That the levy be payable by the person who uses the honey in the production of other goods.

PART III.-INTERPRETATION.

7. That, in this Resolution-

- producer", in relation to honey, mean the person who owned the honey immediately upon its removal from the hive; "the Australian Honey Board" mean the Board proposed to be established under that
- name by the Honey Industry Bill 1962;
- "the Gazette" mean the Commonwealth of Australia Gazette; "the Minister" mean the Minister of State for the Commonwealth for the time being administering the Acts passed to give effect to this Resolution.

Question-put and passed. Resolution to be reported, and leave asked to sit again.
