- 1. The House met, at half-past two o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker (the Honorable Sir John McLeay) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2. PETITIONS.—Mr. Cross presented a Petition from certain electors of the Commonwealth praying that the Government (1) support the United Nations resolution for a Nuclear Test Ban Treaty, (2) ensure that foreign bases are not permitted on Australian soil and (3) in response to the call of the United Nations, declare Australia's willingness to enter into an agreement not to manufacture, test, station or acquire nuclear weapons.

Petition received and read.

Similar Petitions were presented by Mr. Kearney and Mr. O'Connor, and were severally received.

- 3. QUESTIONS .- Questions without notice were answered.
- 4. DEFENCE REVIEW—MINISTERIAL STATEMENT—MOTION FOR PRINTING PAPER.—Sir Robert Menzies (Prime Minister), by leave, made a Ministerial Statement reviewing the defence programme and informed the House of decisions made by the Government to further increase Australian defence preparedness. Sir Robert Menzies then, by command of His Excellency the Governor-General, laid upon the Table the following Paper:—
