MINISTERIAL ARRANGEMENTS.—Sir Robert Menzies (Prime Minister) informed the House that, during the absence abroad of Mr. Townley, Senator Paltridge (Minister for Civil Aviation) would act as Minister for Defence and that in this House Mr. Fairhall (Minister for Supply) would represent the Acting Minister for Defence and Mr. Fairbairn (Minister for Air) would represent the Minister for Civil Aviation.

 Petroleum Search Subsidy Act 1959-1961—Fourth Annual Statement, for year 1962-63.
- 5.
