- 1. The House met, at half-past two o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker (the Honorable Sir John McLeay) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2. QUESTIONS.—Questions without notice were asked.
- 3. COMMONWEALTH EDUCATION CONFERENCE (THIRD)—REPORTS—MINISTERIAL STATEMENT—MOTION TO TAKE NOTE OF PAPERS.—Sir Robert Menzies (Prime Minister), by command of His Excellency the Governor-General, presented the following papers:—

Sir Robert Menzies, by leave, made a ministerial statement in connexion with the Conference, and, by command of His Excellency the Governor-General, presented the following paper:—

  - Mr. Wentworth moved, as an amendment, That the words "as recommended by that Committee" be omitted with a view to inserting the following words in place thereof:—"(a) as recommended by that Committee and (b) by adding to the first paragraph of standing order 107 the words 'Provided that, notwithstanding the provisions of standing order 101, on Thursdays the Speaker shall not read such statement until precedence to general business under standing order 104 has expired or the "Grievance" debate question under standing order 106 has been disposed of, as the case may be.'".
